

MILIVOJ BELIC

Dr. Milivoj Belic completed the School of Mathematics in Belgrade, Yugoslavia in 1970, obtained B.Sc. degree in physics at the University of Belgrade in 1974 and Ph.D. in physics at The City College of New York in 1980 (advisers J. Gersten and M. Lax). He lived and worked in the US for 10 years, in Germany 5, and in Qatar 18. In nineteennineties he spent few years at the Texas A&M University in College Station, as a visiting professor. He is affiliated with the Institute of Physics Belgrade since 1982. Since 2004 Dr. Belic is professor at the Texas A&M University at Qatar (TAMUQ). From 2015 he is Al Sraiya Holding Professor there.

Dr. Belic's research areas include nonlinear optics and nonlinear dynamics, photo-refractive optics, condensed matter physics, and numerical modeling of complex systems,

among others. The recipient of numerous international awards, Dr. Belic received the Galileo Galilei Medal for 2004, awarded by the International Commission for Optics of the International Union of Pure and Applied Physics. He is Senior Member of OSA (Optical Society of America) since 2010.

Thus far Dr. Belic has published 6 books and more than 600 papers that attracted more than 13000 citations, with an h-index of 52 (according to Google Scholar).
